



Red Edge Crassula Crassula 'Red Edge'

A lovely, slow growing shrub with attractive green foliage edged with bright brick red; white flower clusters appear in fall; a wonderful choice for indoor containers and hanging baskets

Features & Attributes

Red Edge Crassula features showy clusters of white star-shaped flowers at the ends of the branches from late fall to mid winter. Its attractive small succulent round leaves remain green in color with distinctive dark red edges throughout the year.

This is a multi-stemmed evergreen houseplant with a spreading, ground-hugging habit of growth. This plant can be pruned at any time to keep it looking its best.

Planting & Growing

When grown indoors, Red Edge Crassula can be expected to grow to be about 8 inches tall at maturity, with a spread of 12 inches. It grows at a slow rate, and under ideal conditions can be expected to live for approximately 15 years. This houseplant will do well in a location that gets either direct or indirect sunlight, although it will usually require a more brightly-lit environment than what artificial indoor lighting alone can provide. It prefers dry to average moisture levels with very well-drained soil, and may die if left in standing water for any length of time. This plant should be watered when the surface of the soil gets dry, and will need watering approximately once each week. Be aware that your particular watering schedule may vary depending on its location in the room, the pot size, plant size and other conditions; if in doubt, ask one of our experts in the store for advice. It is not particular as to soil type or pH; an average potting soil should work just fine. Be warned that parts of this plant are known to be toxic to humans and animals, so special care should be exercised if growing it around children and pets.
